HISTORY

The county is named for Benjamin Logan, second in command of the Kentucky militia during the Revolutionary War and was a leader in the efforts to make Kentucky a state. Logan County was the 13th Kentucky county, and is currently the third largest county in the state.

It's the birthplace of the Great Revival of 1800 and one of Kentucky's oldest counties. It's where the Confederate Government of Kentucky was organized, President Andrew Jackson fought a duel, the legendary Jesse James Gang robbed a bank and where the most southwestern of the Shaker Communities was established.

QLOCATION



Logan County is comfortably situated in the southwestern part of the state and is approx. 556 square miles in size. It is one of the southern tier of counties bordering the northern Tennessee line. Logan County is located centrally in the eastern US within a day's drive of half the nation's population and manufacturing employment. It is strategically amid the growing nearby metro areas of Nashville and Clarksville, Tennessee, and Bowling Green, Kentucky.

It is connected logistically with major four-lane access to Interstates 65, 24, 40, as well as a short trip to Nashville International Airport.



Your Logan County means a focus on excellence in education. Children are prepared with the skills and resources to be successful, contributing citizens and to ensure students will achieve their highest potential for their future.

There are two school districts: Logan County and Russellville Independent. Logan County is the larger, serving 3,500 students who attend one of five elementary/middle schools and a central, comprehensive high school. Russellville Independent serves 1,100 students, including elementary, middle and high school.



LOGAN COUNTY SCHOOLS

A "Great Place To Learn", the Logan County School District provides a strong, supportive and student-centered small town atmosphere that encourages exceptional high academic performance by its students. Students have consistently outperformed students in other districts on state and national achievement tests. As a result, Logan County ranks in the Top 15% (22nd out of 173 districts) of Kentucky school districts and is labeled "Distinguished" under the *Unbridled Learning* accountability system. Logan County is home to two National Blue Ribbon Schools of Excellence and four Middle Schools To Watch.

With funding assistance from a Race to the Top Grant, all six Logan County schools incorporate the nationally recognized Leader in Me program - an innovative, schoolwide model enabling educators to unleash each child's full potential, while focusing on the development of 21st century learning skills. Logan County is dedicated to its commitment of improving student achievement. It truly is a "Great Place To Learn."

RUSSELLVILLE INDEPENDENT

"Every Child, Every Day" is the goal of Russellville Independent Schools (RIS), ensuring that each day individual student challenges are addressed, and individual student success is praised. RIS is committed to encouraging that all students achieve their highest potential, all teachers teach with relevance and rigor, and all teachers establish meaningful relationships with students, parents and the community.

RIS commitment to students has won it much acclaim, including the Kentucky School Board's PEAK award (given to only 2 Kentucky schools yearly) for its outstanding efforts in enhancing student learning skills. A trademark initiative that has brought state and national recognition is their Performance Based Education, encouraging students to progress at a rate conducive to their learning style, allowing students to succeed and advance on their own merited success. Other programs such as GATE (Gifted and Talented Students) offering special education students as well as gifted students support and guidance. The SEAL (Students Engaged in Accelerated Learning) program provides opportunities for those qualifying students engaged in accelerated learning.
